Violence against Women and Gender Diverse People

Safe Steps: Family Violence Response Centre

Safe Steps provides 24/7 specialist support services for anyone in Victoria who is experiencing or afraid of experiencing family violence.

Services include:

- Information and referral
- Crisis response
- Specialist family violence risk assessment
- Safety planning
- Access to supported crisis accommodation

Sexual Assault Crisis Line

A state-wide, after-hours, confidential, telephone crisis counselling service for people who have experienced sexual assault. It operates between 5pm weeknights through to 9am the next day and throughout weekends and public holidays.

Migrant and Refugee Services

InTouch Multicultural Centre Against Family Violence

Djirra
